

ADMINISTERING THE HERI FACULTY SURVEY:

Institutions participating in the HERI Faculty Survey select an administration time anytime between now and May 2, 2014 to best fit their institutional culture.

You have immediate access to your own preliminary results to allow for quick dissemination of relevant findings.

Select the peer comparisons most relevant to you.

Receive an institutional profile designed to provide you with actionable data quickly. The institutional profile includes your results broken out by gender and in comparison with your peer institutions.

Because we know faculty have different concerns, separate reports detail findings for full time, part time, and graduate faculty. This allows you to quickly pinpoint similarities and differences among faculty that may warrant discussion and action.

You will also receive a data file of your faculty responses, a PowerPoint presentation summarizing your results, and a monograph summarizing the national results.

ABOUT THE INSTRUMENT

The HERI Faculty Survey contains a "core" section of questions that all institutions administer. There are specific versions of the survey for 2-year, 4-year, and online institutions.

Institutions can tailor the HERI Faculty Survey to meet specific needs in several important ways:

The Faculty Survey has 5 optional modules that you can add to the "core" survey. Modules are brief sets of related items that institutions may elect to use based on their unique mission, goals, and needs.

- Sexual Orientation and Status Module
- Campus Climate Module
- STEM
- Spirituality
- Academic Advising

Because institutions may have specific questions relevant to their own faculty or community, open and closed-ended questions of institutional or consortial importance also can be added.
