HERI announces three Summer Institutes for 2010:

In the **Research Methods for Critical Analysis of Quantitative Data Institute** participants will learn techniques that will help them identify social and institutional inequities; understand educational processes and outcomes on a large scale; and improve the utility of national databases. Two tracks are offered, one focused on multilevel modeling (instructor Marvin Titus) and the other on social network theory (instructor Cecilia Rios-Aguilar). Institute director: Sylvia Hurtado. **July 13-15.**

The **CIRP Summer Institute** provides three days of intensive training in: the conceptual framework of the CIRP surveys, including the new CIRP constructs; using CIRP datasets for assessment, campus decision-making, and your own research; and analysis techniques using the CIRP constructs. Participants will become familiar with the latest research findings from CIRP in topic areas such as retention, student-faculty interaction, campus climate and diversity. The Institute is taught by expert instructors from the Higher Education Research Institute. **July 28-30.**

The **Diversity Research Institute** provides a framework to assess the institutional climate for diversity, campus diversity practices, and student outcomes. Participants will engage in problem-solving around using assessment to improve diverse learning environments. Facilitated by nationally-known expert in diversity Sylvia Hurtado, Director of the Higher Education Research Institute. **August 4-6.**
