This documentation describes your final data file for the 2007 YFCY Survey, containing the individual responses from your students to the 2007 YFCY survey and, where available the responses made by the same students to the 2006 Freshman Survey (TFS). HERI provides you with two versions off these data for download from the HERI Portal – one in fixed-field text format (...RAWDATA.DAT) and the other in SPSS v.14 System Format (...RAWDATA.SAV). This documentation was designed to apply directly to the text format file, but it can be used equally well with the SPSS System format file.

The number(s) to the right of each variable described in this documentation indicate the column (character) position on the data record where the response for that variable can be found. The 4-8 character name in CAPS and followed by a colon is the name assigned to that variable in the SPSS System file. Descriptions of the variables or groups of variables are in **boldface**, and descriptions of the values that each variable may hold are in *italics*. In the event a set of value descriptions applies to an entire group of variables, the descriptions will appear between the description of that group and the variables themselves. The descriptions of values applying to a single variable appear below the description for that variable.

The data is organized as follows:

Not all students in your data file have matching TFS data. The variable TFSFLAG (column 317) indicates whether or not a particular student has TFS data available. Merging was accomplished by matching YFCY and TFS students by Student ID (columns 304-316), or by Student Name, confirmed by the student's date of birth. Only TFS data for FTFT freshmen were considered for merging, and only if the freshmen participated in the TFS at your institution.

Pursuant to the requirements of UCLA's IRB, HERI can only release you your institution the Student IDs of those students who answered the permission question (PERMIT07 in the data file) "yes".
